


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

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Introduction

This Program Guide is arranged by days. Each section begins with a calendar for a two day period followed by descriptions of the programs for those two days. Several programs have multiple sessions. Each program is described once, but it is referenced on each day a session occurs.

Basic Fair

Fashion & Beauty Course

The Fashion & Beauty Course is included in the basic package as are the key seminars of Modeling Techniques, Fashion Photography, and the two separate weekend workshops: Beauty Fair, and Fashion Fair. We also offer a certificate for those who complete our Charm School.

Luncheon Seminars (Included but you must sign up for each luncheon)

We have a wide variety of topics from which to choose depending on your status (crossdresser or transsexual) and where you are in your personal development. The planned luncheon seminars for '91 are: On The Town Luncheon Seminar, Partners, Senior Crossdressers — Lifestyle Options After Retirement, Counseling the Crossdresser, A New Pathway to Gender Happiness, Legal Aspects of Crossdressing, Erotic Power/Games & The Crossdressing Community, Working As A Woman, and Femininity-Masculinity: A New Look.

FanFair Evening Activities

The include: Welcome Cocktail Party, Ladies Nght Dinner, FanFair Fashion Show, Outreach Awards Banquet, FanFair Follies, Fantasy Ball, and the FanFair Awards Banquet.

Special Programs

Special Programs (Part B) are selected and paid for by you, because they are keyed to your particular needs. They vary from year to year depending upon the professional staff available. For 1991, there are 11Special Programs.

I. Couples In Committed Relationships (\$95/couple)

A special three hour workshop for couples only dealing with issues of intimacy, communication and trust. An interactive presentation by Marilyn Volker, Ed.D.

II. Leadership Training Workshop (No Charge, but you must preregister)

These seminars will sharpen the skills you need to take a leadership role in the CD/CG community. The Workshop consists of three two-hour seminars: (I) Introduction to Leadership & Group Dynamics; (II) Internal Organization & Making It Happen; and (III) Leadership Within the Community & Leadership Beyond the Culture. (Alison Laing, Nancy Cole, Ari Kane, JoAnn Roberts)

III. Personal Development Workshops (\$95/4 sessions)

These programs deal with your personal needs and include: Personal Development I-Self: transcend feelings of insecurity, shame and guilt; Personal Development II- Relationships: how to deal with the feelings of others; The Quest For Femininity: What is "femininity?" Explore different models; The Dream Workshop: A guided-tour of self-discovery. (Niela Miller)

IV. Voice & Speech Improvement (\$125 Basic, \$150 Advanced)

Basic Speech Improvement covers relaxation, resonance, pitch control, pronunciation and conversational style. The Advanced program covers additional work on pitch control, articulation and conversational style. (Dr. "Bud" Heuer)

V. Introduction to B/D & S/M (\$25)

Is S/M sexual abuse or sexual fun? Examine some common myths about S/M,

discuss negotiation, consensuality, terminology and safety. (Henkin & Holiday)

VI. Fashion Photography (No Charge)

Photography is painting with light and sculpting the environment. Learn how to improve your photographic skills in the areas of lighting, posing, backgrounds, camera angles, focus and much more. (Mariette Pathy Allen)

VII. Cosmetic Workshop (\$50 each)

Visit with our professional makeup artists and learn how to apply makeup and create a more feminine visage. (Jim Bridges, Muriel Olive & Vernon Porter)

VIII. Doctor Docter Workshops (\$20 each)

A favorite son of the Fair returns for '91 with two fascinating workshops: Patriarchy & the Paraculture and Building the Ideal Self. (Richard Docter, Ph.D.)

XI. Whale Watch Excursion (\$30)

Learn fascinating facts about the largest mammals on the face of this earth as we go on a four hour cruise to observe these most incredible creatures. (Wendi Kaiser)

X. Guest Seminar Luncheon (\$30)

Each year the Outreach Institute invites to the Fair a special guest who has made, or is making, an outstanding contribution to the transgender community through academic or professional service. This year the guests will be **Bill Henkin** & **Sybil Holiday**. Their topic will be **Alternate Personas**.

XI. Outreach Institute/P'town Arts Assoc. Benefit (\$15)

This special event will commence with a Photo Exhibit of Mariette Pathy Allen's work at 7:00 pm with a cash bar. This will be followed by a special screening of *Paris Is Burning*, the crtically acclaimed documentary of New York's voguing houses. There will be a panel discussion after the film. Rumor has it that *Paris* director, Jennifer Livingston may make an appearance.

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

Marilyn Volker has been a certified sexuality educator for the past 22 years and is currently on the faculty at the University of Miami Medical and Nursing Schools. where she teaches sexuality courses. Dr. Volker is also a member of the board of the Outreach Institute where she addresses the concerns of wives and partners of both transvestites and transsexuals. Dr. Volker will share her views on gender and encourage partner participation in discussions.

• On The Town: This luncheon seminar will be guided by the capable leadership of Laura ("Sweetie Pie"). Laura, and her panel will discuss various aspects of going out in public on the town with a partial focus upon Provincetown. For new-comers and old-timers alike, Laura's panel will provide some practical suggestions on how to handle yourself in public, particularly when you are confronted by unusual situation or confrontations. Questions will be handled by the panel. Laura promises a light and lively seminar. This luncheon is a part of your FanFair package.

COSMETIC WORKSHOP

Jim Bridge's 27 years in the beauty industry has established him as one of the nation's leading beauty authorities. His work encompasses film, stage, and photographic makeup. In addition, Jim did a stint as the regional director of cosmetic training for Revlon in New York city. Now, firmly ensconced in Los Angeles, Jim travels to all the major events in the gender community teaching makeup techniques. This special workshop uses a "hands-on" approach to show you how to create a more attractive feminine face.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT I

Special Program not included in the Basic package. You must preregister for this course. Additional sessions Mon. and Fri.

This workshop helps the new fair-goer and those recently out of the closet transcend feelings of insecurity, shame or guilt. We share our stories, help each other find constructive approaches to some of the difficulties encountered when exercising our right to express our feminine selves, and make a separation between society's and others' problems with crossdressing behavior and our self-imposed problems over which we have total control. The facilitator draws out whatever is of concern to participants and addresses each issue at the level the person is ready to work. The final session will be devoted to a successful transition back to our lives at home.

MEDICAL PANEL WORKSHOP

Personal Development II

Session 1, Sunday, October 20, 12:30 pm

This workshop is for the returning fair-goer, those who have been in Personal Development I, and those who are relatively comfortable with their crossdressing, but want to delve more deeply into the feminine pysche. We work on the development of the inner woman, the recognition and release of feelings, the use of intuition and non-verbal behavior for making connections, and building trusting, loving relationships for support and nuturance. The idea of gender exploration as a Spiritual Path is introduced.

Couples Workshop

The Dance of Intimacy — Leading, Following, or Sitting Out the Dance! The "dance of intimacy" between partners is a life long experience — learning new information and new dance steps adding to the prelearned and expected ones. Intimacy means knowledge of and sharing of one's most personal and private feelings, trusting that the sharing process will be respected.

This interactive presentation will highlight components of intimacy with particular strategies for partners of crossdressers. Eight types of intimacy — only one of which is sexual — will be discussed along with the impact of these types relevant to gender presentation. We will talk sex — and specific challenges to partners. Communications models will be reviewed and YOU — the real experts — will create, share, evaluate, and strategize. You may feel like you are dancing with two, but your knowledge, practice, and willingness to lead, follow, or sit out parts of the dance, can mean a fulfilling, loving, and respectful relationship — keys to the dance of intimacy.

We have a great series of seminar luncheons planned for you this year. Here are the seminars for Tuesday, Oct. 22nd.




LESBIANISM & RELATIONSHIPS

- Counseling the Crossdresser: Niela Miller has spent over 10 years working with the transgendered community. She believes it is a good idea, from time to time, to pause and reflect upon the nature of your work and clients. Here's a chance to hear what a therapist thinks. 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

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

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
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
