Introduction

This Program Guide is arranged by days. Each section begins with a calendar for a two or three day period followed by descriptions of the programs for those two days. Several programs have multiple sessions. Each program is described once, but it is referenced on each day a session occurs.

Basic Fair

● Fashion & Beauty Program

The Fashion & Beauty Program is included in the basic package as are the key seminars of Modeling Techniques, Fashion Photography.

● Luncheon Seminars

We have a wide variety of topics from which to choose depending on your status (crossdresser or transsexual) and where you are in your personal development. A partial list of the 1992 seminars includes: After Coming Out Where Do CD/CG Persons Go? - HIV, An Update And Look Into The Future. - Bigenderism As A Lifestyle Option - How To Work With Your Dreams - The Crossgender Community, A New Look - Crossdressing And The Theatre World - The Gift Of Giving & The Winslow Street Fund - Legal Aspects of CD/CG Behaviors.

● FanFair Evening Activities

These include: Come As You Are Cocktail Party, Annual Ladies' Nite Dinner, Outreach/ P'town Arts Benefit, FanFair Fashion Show, Outreach Awards Banquet, Fan Fair Follies, Apres Follies Supper Party, Fantasy Ball, and the FanFair Awards Banquet.

Special Programs

Special Programs (Part B) are selected and paid for by you, because they are keyed to your particular needs. These vary from year to year depending on the professional staff available. Here are the Special Programs for 1992.

I. Voice & Speech Improvement Programs

Basic Course

An introduction to the understanding of feminine language and thought. Includes illustrative examples of gender differences and interpersonal interactions. Focus is on modification of voicing, melody patterns and articulation.

Advance Course

A personalized analysis of communications patterns and strategies. Individualized exercises are used to enhance communicative behaviors.

Instructor

Moya L. Andrews is a Professor of Speech and Hearing Sciences at Indiana University in Bloomington. She is also director of the Voice Clinic. She has won several important awards in her field and has worked with Dr. Bud Heuer in the study and care of the professional voice. She has presented programs throughout the USA as well as in England, Saudi Arabia and Australia.

II. Sex Love & Intimacy (4 hour program)

Most of us think we know something about sex, love and intimacy. What we don't realize is that our very notions prevent us from fully expressing and receiving love.

Some benefits you may receive from this gentle and powerful workshop are:

- Tools for communicating more openly and vulnerably
- Increased acceptance and love for yourself and others
- Experience of being loved and accepted
- Practice moving through barriers to love and intimacy

- Tools for connecting with other people
- More loving, intimate and health relationships
- Reduced fear of rejection

Carole A. Gras, has been on staff with The Human Awareness Institute's (HAI) Sex, Love and Intimacy Workshops. Carole is a certified, licensed Massage therapist and has trained with HAI, Jack Canfield's Self Esteem Workshops and Insight Transformation Seminars.

Lynn M. Thomas, has been on staff with HAI's Sex, Love and Intimacy Workshops for two years. Mostly recently she has produced the Workshops in New England. She is a lawyer and president of 21st Century Management Consulting. Lynn has trained with HAI, Insight Transformational Seminars, and Pia Mellody. She designs and leads workshops on Boundaries, and Sundry Communication Skills for Businesses.

III. Personal Development Workshops

Returning to be with us at FanFair '92 is Niela Miller, CEO of *People - Systems - Potential*. She will offer participants four new workshops.

● 1. Free To Be Me

In order to release any residual guilt, shame or fear about one's gender conflicted life, it helps a lot to "come out" and tell your story in a supportive group. FanFair is a wonderful atmosphere for newcomers to enhance their personal development and make new friends through sensitive sharing and encouragement to liberate the women inside you.

● 2. How To Be A Woman Among Women

What do women do and how do they behave when they are together? This course enables you to learn the skill of developing a community of women through gentle coaching and practice. Often, people who take this course become lifelong friends as a result. The prerequisite for this course is Free To Be Me or special permission of the instructor.

● 3. Intimate Relationships for the Evolved "I"

What is intimacy? How is it achieved? What is the relationship between our sexuality and our ability to be intimate? What are the gender differences you experience in each role in these areas. Open to all attendees, couples especially welcomed.

● 4. Developing Your Feminine Creativity and Intuition

Using methods and materials from the arts, you will develop intuitive and creative/expressive abilities. Thus, feelings can find form and this, in turn, enables us to be more whole. Come expand your repertoire of ways to express your feminine self in addition to wearing pretty clothes.

IV. Fashion Photography

Photography is painting with light and sculpting the environment. Learn how to improve your photographic skills in the areas of lighting, posing, backgrounds, camera angles, focus and much more. (Instructor: Mariette Pathy Allen)

V. The Dance of Intimacy: A Couples Workshop (Two parts, each 2.5 hours)

This workshop is designed for the couple in a committed relationship where crossdressing is involved. It will focus on the nature of intimacy which involves a knowledge of and sharing of one's most personal and private feelings; trusting that the sharing process will be respected. This couples program offers the following:

- a. opportunities to meet and share with other couples some real life learning experiences
- b. strategies in intimate communications including deal and boundry setting
- c. Knowledge of eight (8) types of intimacy (only one being sex)
- d. skills in coping, caring and communicating
- e. sexuality information to enhance sexual functioning
- f. resources written by and for spouses and partners

The Dance of Intimacy Workshop can be your key to fulfilling, loving and respectful relationship.

Facilitator - Marilyn Volker, EDD. Dr. Volker is a well known sex educator and therapist. She is a diplomate in the American Board of Sexology.

VI. Doctor Docter Workshops

Here all participants would be invited to complete the Cross Gender Identity Scale in advance. In out session, they would be taught how to score this, and how to interpret the results. They would then be able to compare themselves with groups of fetishists, periodic cross dressers, transgenderists (not living full-time) and transgenderists (living full-time), etc. Each participant would leave with his own comparative sub-scale scores for: Feminine gender identity, masculine gender identity, body feminization, feminine role enactment, and sex/pleasure. Each would also have an overall score for intensity of crossgender identity.

We are pleased to have Dr. Richard Docter with us again this year. He will offer a new workshop for participants. It is entitled "Measuring and Understanding Your Crossgender Identity." Dr. Docter is a professor of Psychology at California State University in Northridge, and author of *Transvestites & Transsexuals*.

The Winslow Street Fund

The Winslow Street Fund is a permanent endowment fund of the International Foundation for Gender Education (IFGE). The fund was conceived in 1990 during a series of historic meetings at Chicago House during Fantasia Fair. A Group of dedicated leaders spent most of their week in Provincetown developing a three year strategic plan to meet the growing needs and demands of our community. The financial needs, associated with educating the business, political, medical and social leaders of our country are enormous. The fund will help ease that burden.

The Winslow Street Fund is managed and governed by an independent Board of Trustees, approved by the IFGE Board of Directors. The Trustees are responsible for all policy decisions, including the types of investments, allocation of fund income and principle, and grant making.

The Fund accepts gifts and donations of cash, property, stocks, bonds, life insurance policies, etc. Donations may be made, currently, through the creation of a trust instrument in your will or any other estate planning document you wish. All the necessary documentation regarding any type of gift or donation is available from the IFGE office. The income that comes from investment of your gift or donation goes to support proposals for grants to important programs of educational value to the community. It is hoped that the Winslow Street Fund will serve the CD/CG community in perpetuity.

All 501[c][3] organizations, support groups, services and special projects that will be a benefit to our community are invited to apply to the Winslow Street Fund for financial support. The Trustees will also give consideration to certain grant requests from individuals who meet the guidelines/criteria established by the Board of Trustees.

The Winslow Street Fund is committed to serving all segments of the CD/CG community. Its success will be instrumental in meeting our various needs and concerns for the future. A special luncheon seminar about the Fund will be held during Fantasia Fair 1992.

IX. Outreach Institute/P'town Arts Assoc. Benefit

This special event will take place on Sunday, October 18, 1992 starting with an Hors d'Oeuvre and gourmet select wine fest. Afterwards, there will be a panel presentation entitled *Crossdressing/Crossgender, Perceptions, Ideals, and Realities for the '90s, Four Perspectives*. The panelists include Anne Bolin (noted anthropologist and author of *In Search of Eve*), Vern Bullough (noted social historian and author of *Crossdressing, Sex & Gender*), Richard Docter (noted analytic psychologist and author of *Transvestites & Transsexuals*), and Ari Kane (Executive Director of The Outreach Institute and noted sex educator and counselor).

This is a joint benefit for both the Human Outreach & Achievement Institute and the P'town Art Association Museum. A donation of \$25 admits one to this historic Fan/Fair-PAAM Program. The Museum is located at 460 Commercial St. in Provincetown.

IN YOUR FACE, POLITICS OF THE BODY AND PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE

is our attempt to underscore the significance of one's own body in the formation of personal and political knowledge and action. Historically, such knowing has been relegated as women's work and has been contained, discouraged and negated under the rubric of the personal. Personal knowledge is thus forbidden.

As an over arching condition the forbidden is a precondition to self-censorship. The concept of self-censorship locates censorship within the immediate realm of individual awareness without addressing the social and thus political, mechanisms of control over the individual. Humiliation and fear threaten the development of personal knowledge. Silencing prohibits its accumulation both as personal and cultural history.
